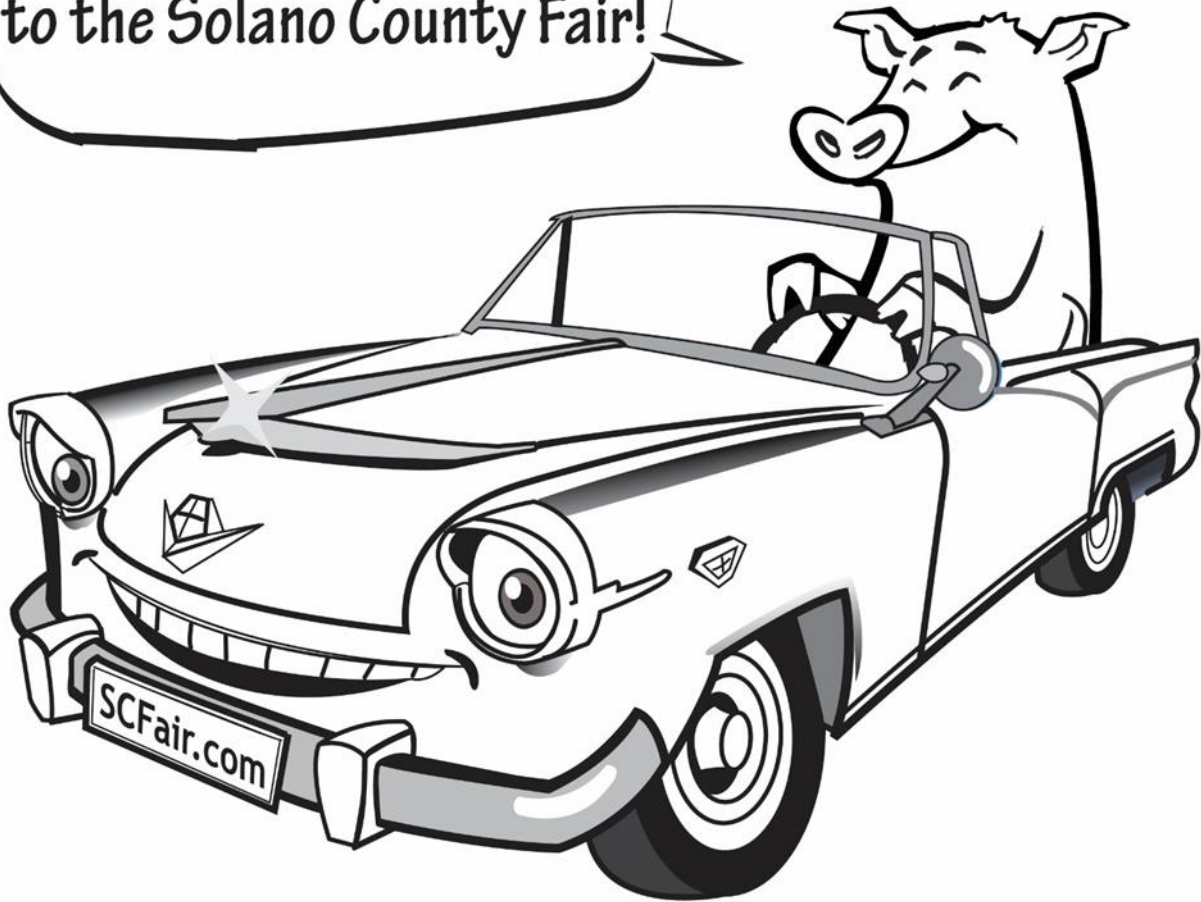

All classes are limited to residents of the State of California unless otherwise specified in an individual division or class.

DEPARTMENT RULES & INFORMATION

- Classes are open to amateurs unless specified for professionals.
- Entry receiving dates, times and locations are noted in each department.
- Exhibitors are responsible for understanding Local and State rules.
- Perishable exhibits will be discarded if they are in an advanced state of deterioration or not picked up during the release date.
- There are no limits on the number of items an exhibitor may enter per class.
- No exhibitor shall receive more than two cash awards in any one class using the American judging system.
- Must have been prepared, grown, made, improved or raised by the exhibitor within one year of the opening date of the Fair.
- Entries must be made by exhibitor and may only be entered once.
- Greatest care will be taken in handling the exhibits; however, no responsibility for loss or damage of any kind can be assumed by the Solano Living Department, the Solano County Fair Association, the County of Solano or its agents. Any insurance desired on entries must be carried by the exhibitor.

SPECIAL RULES & INFORMATION

- Exhibits must be consistent in size and maturity in order to be considered for cash awards.
 - **“Mature”** means having reached that stage of ripeness which will ensure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will ensure palatability after the removal of the product from the tree, plant, or vine.
 - **“Overripe”** means having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption.
- Entries must be labeled with product name and variety.
- Entries are to be delivered on a paper or plastic plate. NO plastic bags please.

2. If the entire project is original, an explanation of the steps should accompany the entry, e.g. tanned hide, cut the leather and tooled the purse.
3. Do not make these crafts with fresh plant material. Items must not be perishable. They must be able to remain presentable for the duration of the Fair.

SPECIAL RULES & INFORMATION

1. All foods must be preserved with appropriate methods as outlined in the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning which can be found online at https://nchfp.uga.edu/publication/s/publications_usda.html. A copy is also available at the fair website and office for viewing.

2. Each entry requires 2 containers: one to be opened for judging and the other to be placed on display. Both jars shall be claimed on pick-up day.
3. All entries must have been preserved within the last 12 months.
4. Both jars/bottles must be labeled with exhibitor's name, division, class, name of food, date preserved, method of preservation. Label must state whether the food was hot or raw packed, boiling water or pressure canned, the process time and the pounds of pressure if pressure canned. Entries without the required label will not be judged.
5. All jars must have lids in good condition with **no dressings** on the lids.
6. Entries must use a standard jar, a container specifically designed for canning purposes. Liquors/Vinegars should be entered in a glass bottle or decanter, minimum 8 oz.
7. All entries must have proper head space.

RECOMMENDED CONTAINERS

- **Fruits and Vegetables:** clear glass, wide or narrow mouth jar, sealed lids, no paraffin seals.
- **Jams:** clear glass, standard jar (squat or tall); sealed lids, no paraffin seals.
- **Jellies:** clear glass, standard jar (squat or tall); sealed lids, no paraffin seals.
- **Dried Exhibits:** Jerky (6 to 8 strips), fruit (6 to 8 pieces), herbs (1 container).
- **Juices:** 2 bottles
- **Liqueurs/Vinegars:** 1 glass bottle or decanter, minimum 8 ounces.

Neatness and uniformity.
Liquid to just cover product with no excess. Clear with little or no cloudiness or small particles from gas bubbles. Fruit syrups have suitable proportion of sugar.

PRODUCT 65%

Absence of defects.
Original food high quality, free from indicated spoilage.
Uniformity-pieces of food reasonably uniform in size (fancy pack not practical).

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Color as nearly that of standard cooked product as possible, free from foreign matter and undue discoloration.

Consistency should be tender without overcooking.

1. Use clear glass jars with lids/seals in good condition. Quart size is recommended. Dressing/decoration on lids is permitted.
2. Submit **1** jar for judging. Jars will not be opened for judging.
3. A recipe must be attached to each entry that lists dry ingredients in the jar, other wet/perishable ingredients needed, and instructions for baking/cooking.
4. Ingredients in jar should be layered, not mixed.

Example: taking an old, rusted wheel barrel and eliminate rust, replace needed hardware or wheel, and repaint.

New-Life Reuse: Find a new use for something without changing its structure. Example: using a jelly jar as a pencil holder.

Upcycle: Taking something and improving it without changing its basic purpose. Example: a small basic end table that is changed by adding a shelf, door, or drawer and repainted or re-stained.

Repurpose: Changing an item to give it a new purpose or use. The materials are used for a purpose other than original intent. Example: plastic grocery bags are crocheted into a place mat.
